Synopsis



A young zombie named Otto appears on a remote highway. He has no idea where he came from or where he is going. After hitching a ride to Berlin and nesting in an abandoned amusement park, he begins to explore the city. Soon he is discovered by underground filmmaker Medea Yarn, who begins to make a documentary about him with the support of her girlfriend, Hella Bent, and her brother Adolf, who operates the camera. Meanwhile, Medea is trying to finish "Up with Dead People," the epic political-porno-zombie movie that she has been working on for years. She convinces its star, Fritz Fritze, to allow the vulnerable Otto to stay in his guest bedroom. When Otto discovers that there is a wallet in his back pocket that contains information about his past, before he was dead, he begins to remember a few details, including memories of his ex-boyfriend, Rudolf. He arranges to meet him at the schoolyard where they met, with devastating results.

Bruce LaBruce, director

Bruce LaBruce is a writer, film-maker, and photographer stuck in the gulag otherwise known as Toronto, Canada. He started out as a child, then quickly moved on to the production of homo punk fanzines (J.D.s [with G.B. Jones], Dumb Bitch Deserves To Die [with Candy Parker]) and super 8 movies (Boy/Girl, I Know What It's Like To Be Dead, Bruce and Pepper Wayne Gacy's Home Movies [with Candy Parker], Slam!). These products helped to launch the so-called Homocore or Queercore movement which corrupted a whole new generation of homosexuals.

In 1991 LaBruce released his first feature length film. No Skin Off My Ass - an exploration of the sordid relationship between a faggoty hairdresser (played by LaBruce himself) and a mute, handsome young skinhead - went on to become a world-wide cult hit. His follow-up feature Super 8 I/2 (1994) is a harrowing cautionary bio-pic about LaBruce's rocky rise to cult stardom. LaBruce may or may not be playing himself in this disturbing film, an aging porn star/director whose career is on the skids owing to his inability to cope with his emerging identification as a cineaste. Super 8 I\2 went on to become a film festival circuit favourite, earning slots in such high-profile fests as Sundance, London, Berlin, Dublin, Thessaloniki, Toronto, Vancouver, San Francisco and Tokyo.

LaBruce's Hustler White, made in collaboration with L.A.-based photog Rick Castro, was released in 1996. Co-starring supermodel Tony Ward and LaBruce himself, Hustler premiered at Sundance and similarly went on to become a film festival and cult favourite. LaBruce plays Jurgen Anger, a foreign faggot who visits Los Angeles to check out the Santa Monica Boulevard hustler scene, strictly for anthropological reasons. It's love at first sight when Jurgen spots Montgomery Ward (Tony Ward) plying his wares at Plummer Park. Hustler White went on to win the grand prize at the International Trash Film Festival.

In late August 1998 LaBruce flew to London, England to shoot his first legitimate porn movie. Skin Flick, produced by Berlin's Cazzo Films, concerns a gang of adorable neo-nazi skinheads which breaks into the home of an annoying, mixed-race, salt-and-pepper, bourgeois gay couple and sexually terrorizes them. The film stars such exiting new stars as Tom International and high fashion model and actress Nikki Uberti, as well as a cast of rising porn stars. Thankfully, LaBruce only has a cameo in Skin Flick, playing a gay-bashing statistic.

In 1998, LaBruce expanded into several new areas - as a photographer and columnist for such magazines as Honcho and Inches, and as a photographer, writer, and interviewer for New York's Index Magazine, to which he was recently named a contributing editor. For many years LaBruce wrote regular columns for Toronto's Eye Magazine and Exclaim, an alternative music monthly. As a writer and/or photographer, LaBruce has contributed to the National Post, the UK Guardian, Vice, Dutch, Butt, Strut, Dazed and Confused, Loyal, Doingbird, The Breeder, Bon, and K48. He has also produced two books, The Reluctant Pornographer, his premature memoirs, from Gutter Press, and Ride, Queer, Ride, a survey of his work from Plug-In Books.

In 2003 LaBruce shot his controversial terrorist movie, The Raspberry Reich.

The Raspberry Reich is an art/porn film that, like all my films, uses pornography as a starting point to

examine sexual politics and homosexual radicalism. (For me, working in pornography is like a genre excercise.) Like my previous two films, "Hustler White" and "Skin Flick", The Raspberry Reich concerns an all-male gang that does not strictly identify itself as homosexual but whose members nonetheless are sexually active with each other. ("Hustler White" is about male prostitutes, "Skin Flick" is about neo-Nazi skinheads.) Each of the movies examines identity politics, emphasizing that homosexual identity is fluid and can be separated from a strict gay politic. In The Raspberry Reich, Gudrun initiates the sexual dynamic between the heterosexual males who idolize her; she recognizes the innate radical potential of homosexual expression and attempts to manipulate it towards her revolutionary ends. The fact that she is constantly quoting Reich and Marcuse is no coincidence: the RAF and other radical movements of the seventies believed in the sexually revolutionary ideals of these post-Freudian thinkers, and fought against all forms of sexual repression and the constraints of gender.

(One of Gudrun's favourite slogans is "Heterosexuality is the Opiate of the Masses!") It is essential that my film engage these notions with sexually explicit content, for in this way it mirrors all the sexual ambivalence and ambiguities of the radical movements that emerged in the sixties which are now being revived in art and fashion, but which could soon become a new social and political force in modern culture.

Jürgen Brüning Filmproduction

Jürgen Brüning had a frivolous upbringing at a river called Rhine in the neighbourhood of Cologne. His sociological studies had its realistic experiences in some squatted houses in Berlin. In 1983 he came in contact with the Cinema of Transgeression and met the icons of this movement: Richard Kern, Nick Zedd, Ela Troyano and Tessa Hughes-Freeland.

In 1986 Richard Kern's film "Fingered" with Lydia Lunch, which Brüning distributed in Germany, made a scandelous impression at the Berlin Film Festival and its following theatrical release at Brüning's cinema called Eiszeit. In 1988 Brüning moved to Buffalo, New York to focus on his own filmwork. He produced videos on Rosa von Praunheim, Gays in Thailand and Gay Skinheads in Berlin.

His collaboration with Bruce LaBruce started in 1990 and has flourished into the conception of four masterpieces.

Nan Goldin went on a trip with him in 1992 to do stills for his documentation "Maybe I Can Give You Sex?".

HIROYUKI Oki, a young Japanese director, worked with him on a film portraying young adult men in Kochi, Japan.

Explicit imagery is consistent in Brüning's work. In 1996 he made his first commercial porn film "Bulging Bavarians". The porn label "Cazzo", which he founded in 1996 became soon an important part of the contemporary pop culture.

With three porn actors he realised a feature film called "West Fucks East ". Lately he has produced a new film with Bruce LaBruce called "The Raspberry Reich" and finished his own feature "Saudade", entirely shot in Brazil.

Jürgen Brüning Filmproduktion created Otto; or, Up with Dead People in 2007 in collaboration with New Real Films (Toronto) and Hartmann & Huber Filmproduktion (Berlin).

New Real Films

New Real Films is a feature film company committed to innovation and creativity. Working in a wide range of budgets and genres, new real develops and produces entertaining and original independent drama.

The Principals

Jennifer Jonas is a literature grad from McGill and Cambridge who left academia after her first film experience on Quest for Fire. Her latest feature film, Toronto Stories just wrapped principal photography. She has just completed Bruce LaBruce's gay zombie movie, Otto; or, Up with Dead People which will have its world premieres at Sundance and Berlin 2008. All Hat starring Keith Carradine, Luke Kirby and Rachel Leigh Cook premiered at Toronto International Film Festival 2007 for which she was nominated CFTPA Producer of the Year. She produced Monkey Warfare starring

Don McKellar and Tracy Wright which won a Special Jury Prize at the Toronto International Film Festival 2006. Her credits include executive producer of Cake starring Heather Graham and Sandra Oh, and Sugar, starring Brendan Fehr, both coproduced with New Real Films. She produced Don McKellar's feature film Childstar starring Jennifer Jason Leigh with Rhombus Media for which Leigh won a Genie. Other feature film credits as producer include The Perfect Son starring Colm Feore, The Life Before This (co-producer), Perfect Pie (co-producer) and the Cannes Film Festival Prix de la Jeunesse Winner, Last Night (associate producer). For television, Jennifer has produced Grammy-nominated, Satie and Suzanne as well as Firebird and Elizabeth Rex for Rhombus Media. As Assistant Director, Jennifer worked on Eye of the Beholder, the Academy Award-winning The Red Violin and the internationally acclaimed Thirty-Two Short Films About Glenn Gould.

Leonard Farlinger is a writer/director. His latest feature All Hat was written by novelist Brad Smith and has been nominated for an ACTRA Award for best male performance. It will be released in early 2008. He produced the feature films, Otto; or, Up With Dead People and Monkey Warfare. He directed the Gemini-winning MOW, In The Dark starring Kathleen Robertson about Montreal's famous LSD experiments. A three-time Genie Nominee for best short film, he is a graduate of the Canadian Film Center. His first feature, The Perfect Son was nominated for two Best Actor Genies and premiered at the Toronto International Film Festival 2001. He is currently writing three feature films including adaptations of the best-selling novels, A Discovery of Strangers by Rudy Wiebe and Saigon by Anthony Grey.

New Real has diverse projects in development including A Discovery of Strangers from the Arctic exploration Governor General's award-winning novel by Rudy Wiebe and Von Gloeden by Michael Turner and Bruce LaBruce, as well as as Reg Harkma's follow-up to Monkey Warfare entitled Leslie, My Name is Evil.

Heinz und Horst Filmproduktion was founded in March 2002 by photographer Jörn Hartmann and music producer Michael Huber. 2005 the first feature film production was realized. The feature called 18.15 Uhr ab Ostkreuz had its premiere at the Berlin Film Festival. Since then, several short films were produced and in 2007 the coproduction Otto; Or, Up With Dead People, directed by Bruce LaBruce, was the company's first step into international feature film production.
